A Resolution of the County Supervisors Association of Arizona Expressing Support for the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act and Urging the United States Senate and House of Representatives to Promptly Enact This Legislation and to Recognize Resolution Copper Company for its Significant Investments and Efforts to Develop a New Copper Mine and Enhance the Local, State and National Economies

WHEREAS, the COUNTY SUPERVISORS ASSOCIATION OF ARIZONA recognizes the importance of regional economic development; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY SUPERVISORS ASSOCIATION OF ARIZONA recognizes the significant role that Copper Mining has played in the history of our area and the State of Arizona for more than 100 years; and

WHEREAS, Resolution Copper is actively engaged in the development of an environmentally sound, socially responsible underground mining project in and around the Oak Flat area east of the Town of Superior in Pinal County; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY SUPERVISORS ASSOCIATION OF ARIZONA understands the importance of the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act and Arizona's economic future and urges the United States Senate and House of Representatives to expeditiously pass this legislation; and
