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### JLBC Presents Budget Updates to House Caucus

On Tuesday, the Joint Legislative Budget Committee (JLBC) briefed the House Caucuses on the major differences between the executive and JLBC baseline budgets over a four year period (FY18-FY20).

Director Richard Stavneak presented to the House Majority Caucus and Stefan Sheperd presented to the House Minority Caucus. The presentations covered the on-going and on-time revenue and spending items propose in the executive's budget. Members were given a line-by-line overview of the various revenue and spending items to prepare for the crafting of the legislative budget. JLBC noted that the December and January sales and income tax revenues have exceeded forecast.

There was discussion regarding the on-going versus one-time nature of these increased revenues, and members expressed a desire to use these extra monies to pay down debt and other existing state commitments.

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### **Governor Ducey Forms Arizona Cybersecurity Team**

This week Governor Doug Ducey issued an executive order to create the Arizona Cybersecurity Team (ACT), a team of experts from state, local, and federal government, the



team of experts from state, local, and federal government, the private sector, and higher education to work together to protect Arizonans from a cyber-attack.

Government, businesses, and citizens are faced with a challenging and complex task of securing critical information online. To accomplish this, the cyber security team will enhance collaboration among government, private sector, law enforcement, non-profit organizations, higher education, and the greater Arizona community to address cybersecurity statewide and advise and provide recommendations to the governor.

"The creation of the Arizona Cybersecurity Team is another step we can take to enhance our cyber preparedness," said Governor Ducey. "In today's world, the threat of cyber-attacks is persistent and constantly evolving, which is why we are taking proactive steps to mitigate that threat and making sure agencies continually improve their cyber defenses."

- HB 2190 county improvement districts; repayment agreements (Mitchell)- Passed the House 57-0, transmitted to the Senate. On Senate Natural Resources Energy & Water Committee agenda, Monday, March 5, at 2:00 p.m. in Senate Hearing Room 109.
- HB 2274 county contributions; hospitalization; medical; repeal (Thorpe) –Passed the House 58-0, transmitted to the Senate. Referred to Senate Health & Human Services and Appropriations Committees.
- 3) <u>HB 2413 public road maintenance: primitive designation</u> (*Cook*)- Passed the House 58-0, transmitted to the Senate. Passed Senate Government Committee 7-0, awaiting Rules.
- 4) HB 2415 juvenile dependency proceedings fund (Cobb) –Passed the House 51-7, transmitted to the Senate. Referred to Senate Appropriations and Judiciary Committees.
- 5) <u>HB 2439 county contributions: committee youth; repeal (Thorpe)</u> –Passed the House 55-3, transmitted to the Senate. Referred to Senate Appropriations and Judiciary Committees.
- 6) SB 1038 state land payments; payment method (*Griffin*)-Passed the Senate 30-0, transmitted to the House. Passed House Land, Agriculture & Rural Affairs Committee 8-0.
- 7) <u>SB 1113 zoning violations; notice; service</u> (*Fann*)-Passed the Senate 23-5, transmitted to the House. Passed House Local & International Affairs Committee 5-0.
- 8) SB 1410 transient lodging tax; rural counties (Borrelli)- Referred to Senate Finance.
