Measures on the Ballot

The following measures were passed by the legislature or submitted the qualified number of signatures and are currently qualified for the 2018 general election ballot. The Arizona Legislative Council (Council) is required to prepare an impartial analysis of all ballot measures. Links to the approved analyses are included below and will be in the publicity pamphlet published by the Secretary of State (A.R.S. § 19-124(B)).

Proposition 125 (HCR2032)* Related to Public Retirement Systems	Constitutional Legislative Referendum	ADOPTED ANALYSIS & MEASURE	FOR & AGAINST
Description	Proposal to make adjustments to the Elected Officials' Retirement Plan (EORP) and the Corrections Officer Retirement Plan (CORP) by amending the pension clause of the Arizona Constitution to provide an exception for certain adjustments to EORP and CORP.

Proposition 126 (C-05-2018)* "The Protect Arizona Taxpayers Act"	Constitutional Initiative Measure	ADOPTED ANALYSIS & MEASURE	FOR & AGAINST
Description	This measure would amend the Arizona Constitution to prohibit the state government, other political subdivision and taxing districts, from imposing or increasing any transaction based taxes, fees, stamp requirements, or assessments on any service performed in Arizona, or on the gross receipts of sales or gross income derived from any service performed in Arizona.

Proposition 127 (C-04-2018)* "Clean Energy for a Healthy Arizona"	Constitutional Initiative Measure	ADOPTED ANALYSIS & MEASURE	FOR & AGAINST
Description	The initiative requires affected electric utilities to provide at least 50% of their annual retail sales of electricity from renewable energy sources by 2030.

Proposition 305 (R-02-2018) "Save Our Schools Arizona"	Statutory Citizens' Referendum	ADOPTED ANALYSIS & MEASURE	FOR & AGAINST
Description	This petition seeks to refer 2017 Laws, Chapter 139 (SB 1431), the principal provisions of which expand eligibility for Empowerment Scholarship Accounts (ESAs), commonly referred to as school vouchers; remove the existing ESA enrollment cap, and increase it annually by 0.5% of total public school enrollment through 2022; and cap ESA enrollment in 2023. SB 1431 includes other provisions, including but not limited to the administration of the ESA Program, distribution of ESA monies, and adoption of policies and procedures.

Proposition 306 (HCR2007) Related to the Citizens Clean Elections Act	Statutory Legislative Referendum	ADOPTED ANALYSIS & MEASURE	FOR & AGAINST
Description	Proposal to prohibit payment from clean elections campaign accounts to political parties or specified tax-exempt organizations. Additionally seeks to remove language exempting the Citizens Clean Elections Commission from rulemaking requirements.
