This week the Cochise County Board of Supervisors unanimously appointed Tom Borer to replace Pat Call as District 1 Supervisor, after Call's appointment as the Sierra Vista Justice of the Peace. Supervisor Borer's appointment was effective March 4<sup>th</sup>, and he will remain in the post until the 2020 General Election.

Supervisor Borer has a history of involvement in public service and served as the civilian Deputy Garrison Commander from 2008 until retirement in 2015. Borer also served as a member of the Cochise County Planning & Zoning Commission and the Cochise County Sherriff's Assist Team.



## **Arizona Department of Water Resources Presentation**

The Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) Director Thomas Buschatzke presented to the House Natural Resources, Energy and Water Committee. Director Buschatzke provided an update on the Drought Contingency Plan,

background data related to water use in Arizona, and described the Governors new Water Augmentation, Innovation & Conservation Council. He also discussed active management area plans.

Director Buschatzke noted that ADWR's mission is to be "the steward of Arizona's water future and ensure a long-term, reliable water supply to support the continued economic prosperity of the State." Some of ADWR's critical functions are Colorado River management, statewide regional planning, dam safety, flood mitigation, hydrology and technical assistance to the General Stream Adjudication.

The 54th Legislature, First Regular Session marks its 54th day of the legislative session today. 1289 bills and 96 memorials/resolutions have been introduced this session.

Bills that have made it through their house of origin have begun to receive hearings in the opposite chamber and have until March 29<sup>th</sup> to be heard.

## **CSA Legislative Update**

The status of CSA's legislative agenda package is as follows:

- 1) CSA Legislative Budget Priorities
  - <u>SB 1140 county contributions; committed youth; repeal</u> (*Leach*), passed House Appropriations on March 6<sup>th</sup> with a 10-0 vote.
  - <u>HB 2429 appropriations; EORP contributions; counties</u> (*Thorpe*), passed out of House rules with a vote of 7-0 on March 6<sup>th</sup> and cleared both caucuses on March 7<sup>th</sup>.
  - SB 1293 appropriations; EORP contributions; counties (Gowan), pending committee assignment in the House.
- 2) <u>HB 2467 NOW: west basin water users; committee</u> (*Cobb*), cleared COW with an amendment that added the State Land Commissioner as a nonvoting member of both the Mohave County and La Paz County West Basin Water Users Study Committees.
- 3) HB 2316 junk vehicles; removal; counties (Campbell), held pending committee assignment.
- 4) HB 2277 indigent defense funds (Biasiucci), did not receive a hearing in House Appropriations, leaving the discussion to ultimately be had as part of the budget negotiations.
- 5) HB 2702 TPT; marketplace facilitators; nexus (Toma), pending a hearing in the House Rules Committee.
- SB 1084 funeral; last illness; expenses; lien (Borrelli), assigned to the House Judiciary Committee
