Navajo County Supervisor Jason Whiting welcomed the County Managers Association to Navajo County this week for their monthly meeting. Discussions addressed a variety of issues, including the recent shooting incident in Navajo County and strategies to improve response and communications during active shooter scenarios.



CSA staff also reviewed all the legislative proposals that have been submitted to the association so far, for consideration by the full board.

Additionally, Yavapai County School Superintendent, Tim Carter, presented on the AESA Student Loan Forgiveness Program, which he has used in his county to help alleviate the problems of teacher recruitment and retention.

On August 6, 2016 a majority of the 374 new bills that were signed into law by Governor Doug Ducey took effect. This does not include bills that went into effect immediately under an emergency clause, and a few additional bills that had a delayed effective date.

This Week in Arizona History...

On August 8, 1933, over three quarters of the state voted in favor of repealing Prohibition, making Arizona the 21st state to do so.

This vote paved the way towards ending the nationwide ban on the production, importation, transportation, and sales of alcoholic beverages. Later that year, on December 5th, Prohibition officially ended with the ratification of the Twenty-first Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.
