Former Apache County Supervisor Jimmy Claw, Sr., Passes Away

This past weekend Apache County was saddened to hear of the passing of Mr. Jim Claw, Sr. on June 9. Mr. Claw was well-known in the community, having served two terms as an Apache County Supervisor, and spending more than 20 years as a member of the Chinle Unified School District Board. He was dedicated in his work for the Navajo Tribe, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the National Park Service, and the Rough Rock Community School.

Mr. Claw is survived by his wife, two sons, sister, brothers, and six grandchildren. Funeral services were held on June 15 at the Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Church in Chinle, Arizona.

This Week in Arizona History

June 11, 2017 marked 149 years since the birth of one of Arizona's most well-known philanthropists and civic leaders: Maie Bartlett Heard. Born June 11, 1868, Maie spent her early years in Chicago, and in the mid-1890's she and her husband, Dwight Heard, moved west and settled in a little town called Phoenix. It was here in Phoenix where Dwight Heard became a successful rancher, president of the Arizona Cotton Association, and an active business man, buying what is now known as *The Arizona Republic* newspaper and publishing it up until his death in 1929.

Maie and her husband began their collection of Indian art with a simple Pima basket. After many years, the collection became so extensive that they built and endowed a small museum, the Heard Museum, which opened in 1929. In addition to being a collector and

connoisseur of art, and curator of the museum, Maie dedicated her life to helping and caring for the community through her volunteerism, her foundation of The Welfare League, her donation of land for the building of the Phoenix Civic Center, and so much more. Maie received a number of accolades for her service to the community, and was inducted into the Arizona Women's Hall of Fame in 1982.
