



### **Sales Tax Revenues**

Factors in future growth

#### **Tax Base Increase**

- Driven largely by economic growth
- Changing economy may lead to degradation of the base
- Ballot proposition to ban sales tax on services may permanently limit the base

#### **Rate Increase**

- State TPT rate unlikely to increase
- Local excise rate capped at 10% of the state rate (currently 0.5%)



### Sales Tax Composition

- Retail makes up the **largest portion** of the Arizona sales tax base.
- It has grown in size from 46% of the base in FY08 to **55%** in FY17.
- Other growing classes of TPT include:
  - Restaurants and Bars
  - Hotel/Motel
  - Amusements
- Shrinking class classes of TPT include:
  - Communications
  - Job Printing


#### E-commerce as a percent of total retail sales

### **Concerns: the New Economy**

- Retail growth will continue to shift towards e-commerce as more people purchase goods online.
- Consumption of goods is shifting from physical to digital.
- Consumer spending is now mostly on services, not goods.
- We aren't certain what revenue we are receiving from purchases made online, or on digital goods.
- Current sales tax system isn't set up to deal with these shifting markets.
